

STRENGTHENING ILLINOIS' PUBLIC HEALTH WORKFORCE AND INFRASTRUCTURE

The Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), a recipient of the <u>Public Health Infrastructure Grant</u> from the CDC, has selected the P3RC to serve as a five-year <u>academic partner</u> to support the expansion and strengthening of the public health system and workforce in Illinois. The P3RC team, led by Associate Director <u>Christina Welter</u>, will leverage its experience and relationships across academia and public health practice to bring partners across Illinois together to assess current needs and create a shared vision for the future public health system.



The P3RC welcomes back <u>Sarah Kerch</u> as the assistant director for leadership, organizational change, and workforce development. Kerch, also a current UIC DrPH student, oversees the day-to-day project activities in collaboration with the P3RC team and IDPH. Sarah previously worked at the UIC SPH from 2013–2015 through funding from IDPH and CDC's Community Transformation Grant, supporting local health departments in improving chronic disease prevention in their communities through policy, systems, and environmental change.



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PARTNER SPOTLIGHT Action For Healthy Kids Awards \$30 Million in Subgrants to 264 School Districts Nationwide



In August 2023, P3RC School Research and Translation Committee member Action for Healthy Kids partnered with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) as they invested nearly \$30 million to support school nutrition in 264 small and rural communities across the nation. The funding will support schools in reorganizing their food system structures through staff training, kitchen updates, re-design of food preparation and service spaces, and other supports for school nutrition professionals.

P3RC CONTRIBUTES TO LAUNCH OF LEARNING COMMUNITY FOR CPS STAFF

Chicago Public Schools (CPS) has launched a professional learning community in response to conversations with CPS school staff and data collected through the <u>Healthy CPS Network Initiative</u>, the core research project at the P3RC. The professional learning community will support all 24 schools served by the CPS Network specialist, who has been providing wellness support to the Network for over a year. Membership in the professional learning community will include five meetings during



the 2023-2024 academic year, compensation for involvement, and opportunities to discuss common challenges, share lessons learned, and partnerships to improve key health and wellness policy compliance indicators.

ILLINOIS PUBLIC HEALTH ADMINISTRATORS HOLD FIRST MEMBER CONFERENCE WITH P3RC SUPPORT



In September 2023, the <u>Illinois Association of Public Health Administrators</u> (IAPHA) held their first-ever conference in East Peoria. The P3RC supported the conference through funding, technical assistance, and kicked off the conference with a workshop on the <u>Learning Agenda for Systems Change</u>. The IAPHA Core Planning team tailored the conference to address their membership's professional development and learning needs. National speakers gave trainings with topics ranging from legislation to leadership and administrators engaged with each other and shared innovative ideas to bring back to their counties.

Hillary Aggertt, conference core planning team member, shared photos and highlights from the conference in a P3RC <u>blog post</u>. In addition to the IAPHA member conference, the P3RC also partnered with the <u>Region V Public Health Training Center</u> and IAPHA to hold two virtual trainings on traumainformed supervision for LHD administrators and mid-level management staff.
